MSH POLICE OFFICERS GRADUATE FROM DWI AND SFST SCHOOL

WHITFIELD—Five Mississippi State Hospital police officers have recently passed the DWI and Standardized Field Sobriety Test School, an advanced training course designed to save lives by getting drunk drivers off the road.

Conducted by the Mississippi Law Enforcement Liaison's Office and the National Highway Safety Traffic Administration, the school includes a three day course with two written exams and two practical exams officers must complete with a minimum score of 80 percent to pass the exam. Of the approximately 8,000 law enforcement officers in the state, only 1,400 have successfully completed the training. In all, 18 MSH officers have completed the class.
